FCF-SPONSORED FAMILY CAMP

Rules and Considerations

(In effect from the arrival of the first day of camp, until the departure of the last camper.)

1. Family Camp will open at 7:00 am on Friday. No persons are to be at the camp before 7 am Friday without special permission.
2. Participants should strive to be in Rendezvous attire soon after arriving and throughout the camp.
3. Pre-1840 dress and gear is the era portrayed.
4. No handguns are allowed at Royal Ranger events.
5. No loaded firearms in camp.
6. No modern shelter materials will be allowed in the primitive camp area. This includes colored nylon tents, U.S. Govt. O.D. green, mountain tents, etc.
7. Avoid using Coleman or electric lanterns in the primitive areas. The only exception may be inside a lodge well hidden from view.
8. Stoves, water containers, and coolers should be kept covered throughout the camp.
9. Your fires are your responsibility. Keep them under control.
10. All fires must be in metal containers with a minimum of 2" clearance off ground.
11. First Aid will be available in those camps marked with a red cross flag.
12. Campers will be responsible for their actions.
13. There will be a bulletin board located at the registration area. Check it for schedules and notices.
14. **Absolutely NO DOGS or PETS allowed in camp.**
15. Parents are responsible for the safety and well being of their children. Please be aware of where they are and the extent of their participation in the activities of the camp.
16. All persons must be registered before being allowed to set up camp.
17. Quiet time is after the hours of 11pm. Please be courteous to those around your camp. **(No music or singing please). Many have small children that are sleeping; many others need their sleep.**
18. Be aware of the events on the schedule and take advantage of all that the camp has to offer. Events have been scheduled to allow you to spend time with your family. Do your best to make it a memorable experience.



The Rules and Considerations are for you, to help you know what is or is not allowable. We hope this will provide for a trouble-free weekend and an accident-free one also. Many people have spent a great deal of time and effort on their outfits and other gear in an effort to create an atmosphere of a primitive rendezvous. With your cooperation we can have the best primitive camp ever.

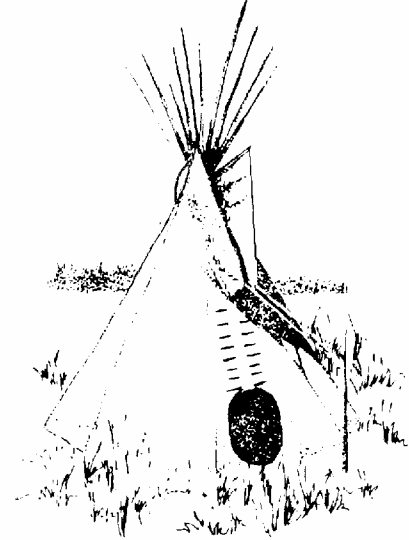
Family Camp Activities

Primitive/Modern Lodges

Tee Pees, Bakers tents, lean-tos, and other authentic replicas will set up in the areas marked primitive. All non-authentic tents will set up in the areas designated as modern.

Dress and Attire

Clothing should be primitive style when in the primitive area. This helps to give the camp a real feeling of the early 1800's and allows for some great pictures. Those camping in the primitive area should avoid showing modern gear as much as possible. (We know this is tough but just do the best you can by covering non-period type items.) Costumes will be judged Sunday morning directly after church. Look your best and you may be chosen as the best primitive dressed.



Quilt Cooperative

The ladies will be sewing a quilt together throughout the camp. You are encouraged to sew a portion of the material by hand into this project. The quilt will be given away at some point during the camp.

Children's Activities

There will be plenty of age-related activities for the kids!

Auction

The Auction items are donated by individuals. If you have anything you would like to donate to the Family Camp Auction, please let Rick Dostal know. Moneys are used to cover the costs of Family Camp. This is your chance to pick up some very nice items and help support the FCF at the same time.

Trading Post and Traders Row

Those wishing to trade or sell their wares should display items at their campsite. The Ranger Store will have a large Trading Post on site with lots of new items for sale.

Saturday Dessert Social

The "Saturday Dessert Social" was suggested last year, and will again be held after the evening council fire service. This will be held at the Large Picnic area (above the council fire area, and next to the westend of the parking lot). Bring your best desserts, paper plates, fork or knife and let's try different desserts and be sociable ! Punch and cups will be supplied by FCF staff.
